### 2. How will the cost of a COVID-19 vaccine be covered?

At this time, the costs related to the COVID-19 vaccine and its administration are typically being paid by governments and there should be no cost of the vaccine or its administration.

### 3. Who can take the vaccine? Are there any restrictions?

<b>UAE</b>	The vaccine is available for all UAE nationals and residents aged 16 years and above. Visit visa holders are not allowed to be inoculated at this time.
<b>KSA</b>	Priority is given to the following <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ The elderly</li> <li>➤ People with obesity</li> <li>➤ People who have two of the following diseases <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>○ Diabetes</li> <li>○ High blood pressure</li> <li>○ Cardiovascular disease</li> <li>○ Cancer</li> <li>○ Immunodeficiency disease</li> <li>○ Chest and respiratory disease</li> <li>○ Kidney disease</li> </ul> </li> <li>➤ Workers and professionals most vulnerable to infection with COVID-19 due to their frequent direct contact with infected people</li> </ul>
<b>Qatar</b>	The vaccine is available only to <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Residents over the age of 70</li> <li>➤ Frontline healthcare workers</li> <li>➤ People suffering from chronic diseases</li> </ul>
<b>Bahrain</b>	The vaccine is available for all citizens and residents aged 18 years and above
<b>Oman</b>	The vaccine is available only to citizens and residents in high-risk groups including <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ The Elderly</li> <li>➤ Those with chronic diseases (diabetes, kidney failure on dialysis, chronic lung diseases)</li> <li>➤ Healthcare workers who provide direct service to COVID-19 patients</li> </ul>
<b>Kuwait</b>	The vaccine is available only to <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>➤ Elderly Citizens and Residents</li> <li>➤ Frontline healthcare workers</li> </ul>

<b>Jordan</b>	The vaccine is available for all citizens and residents aged 18 years and above
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#### 4. How can I register to receive the vaccination?

<b>KSA</b>	Registration for the test is available via the Sehhaty app
<b>Qatar</b>	Residents will receive an SMS and a phone call from the PHCC to book an appointment.

<b>Oman</b>	No appointment required. Eligible people need to visit the nearest government health center to receive their vaccine dosage.
